Union Township

History in the Making

he Union Township story began 350 years ago, when English settlers first arrived in New Jersey and set about the difficult and dangerous task of carving a new colony out of the wilderness. Their first foothold, Elizabethtown, encompassed land that included present-day Union Township. However, it would be several more years before a group of families pushed west and actually set down roots here. Many of these pioneers journeyed from Connecticut under the leadership of the reverend Samuel Pierson: consequently, the area was known for a century-and-a-half as Connecticut Farms. It was famous for, among other things, a particular type of hard cider known as Jersey Lightning.

During the struggle for independence, the residents of Connecticut Farms found themselves between the Redcoats and Washington's troops in Morristown. The militia turned back a combined force of British and Hessian soldiers at the Rahway River in the Battle of Springfield on June 23, 1780. The citizen-soldiers fought fiercely, outraged by the murder of Hannah Caldwell two weeks earlier. Caldwell, the wife of a popular minister, had been felled by a musket shot in her home while playing with her children. On the night after the battle, enemy soldiers (who may have imbibed some Jersey Lightning) broke into Liberty Hall and encountered one of Governor William Livingston's daughters in a white nightgown, backlit by an electrical storm. They fled in terror, believing her to be Hannah's ghost. Caldwell's death is memorialized in the official seal of Union County.

In 1808, the close-knit farming community officially broke off from Elizabeth and chose the name Union. Among its most prominent families were the Keans, who married into the Livingston family and—three years after the township changed its namepurchased Liberty Hall. Over the next 196 years, the Keans lived in the historic structure, distinguishing themselves generation after generation in business and politics. In 2007, Liberty Hall became part of the Kean University campus. The school had moved to Union from Newark in 1958.

From a population of just a few thousand in the late 1800s, the township saw its numbers increase steadily throughout the 20th century. Farms gave way to residential neighborhoods as New Jersey grew and people migrated from the state's urban enclaves to its sylvan suburbs. Light industry followed, creating employment opportunities and boosting the population into the tens of thousands by the 1950s.

Today, Union is home to more than 55,000 people. It boasts two distinct cultural and commercial arteries— Union Center, a downtown shopping district, and busy Route 22-along with dozens of parks, playgrounds and athletic fields. In 2008, Union celebrated its bicentennial. That same year, it was ranked among the Top 100 places to live in America by CNN and Money magazine.
