ain Street. The words mean different things to different people. To some, Main Street evokes pleasing images of friendly waves, strolling shoppers and small-town charm. To others, it represents a dynamic blend of reimagined workspace, targeted retail and a vibrant restaurant scene. Westfield, a historic town settled in 1720, has managed to create a downtown district that is more than a little bit of both.

Indeed, in less than a generation, "old" Westfield has transformed itself into a vital hub of new businesses and new ideas—perfectly attuned to the myriad lifestyles of the 30,000 people who call the town home and its many visitors who travel from afar.


This was no small feat. Fighting the tide of mall culture took a combination of grit and faith most towns simply don't possess. It meant building around Westfield's traditional go-to stores and restaurants, attracting key national chains such as Trader Joe's, Williams-Sonoma and, recently, Urban Outfitters—all complementing Lord & Taylor, which has called Westfield home since 1961. Under the inspired stewardship of Downtown Westfield Corporation, Westfield's Main Street organization, the town has also fostered the kind of supportive, entrepreneurial atmosphere that encourages unique businesses to invest in downtown.

The results speak for themselves...

Fewer and fewer discerning shoppers in and around Union County are saying, "Let's go to the mall." More and more are saying, "Hey...let's go to Westfield!"

That goes for Westfielders, as well as folks in surrounding towns like Mountainside, Scotch Plains, Clark, Springfield, Kenilworth, Cranford and Garwood, too. What makes Westfield worth the trip also happens to make it a one-of-a-kind place to live. The sylvan neighborhoods radiating out from downtown feature a wide range of homes and price points in actual *neighborhoods*—not cloistered developments where no one knows anyone else's name. Downtown serves as a touchstone, a frame of reference, a place where you exchange pleasantries and ideas over a quick sandwich or linger over a world-class meal.

A great downtown doesn't exist long on its own, of course. It is part of a bigger picture that is characterized by quality, convenience and a strong sense of community. Westfield has its own symphony orchestra, the legendary all-digital Rialto Theater, amazing sports and recreation programs, a first-rate school system, and a jam-packed schedule of fairs and festivals and special events. It is truly a crossroad of commerce and community spirit.



estfield's downtown district dates back to the 1720's, when the town was first settled. Situated on a main route from New York to Philadelphia, it saw its share of action during the Revolutionary War. But not until the Civil War—when a new rail line made access to Newark easier—did Westfield begin to grow from a few hundred residents to the 30,000-plus people who call the town home today. Here is a decade-by-decade look backwards at Westfield's news-making events...

2013 Carlo's Bakery—of *Cake Boss* fame—announces it will open a store in downtown Westfield.

2003 The new science wing of Westfield High opens.


1993 Main Street Westfield (now DWC) is established to revitalize downtown.

- **1893** Electric and telephone service come to the entire town.
